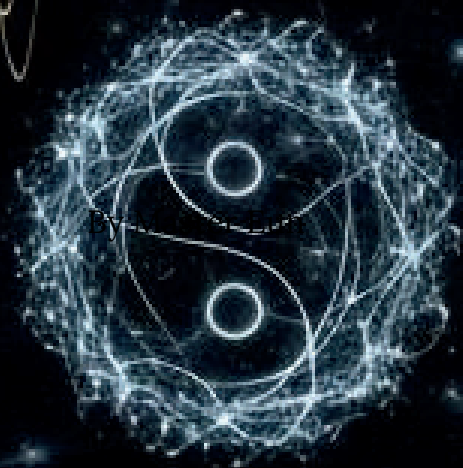
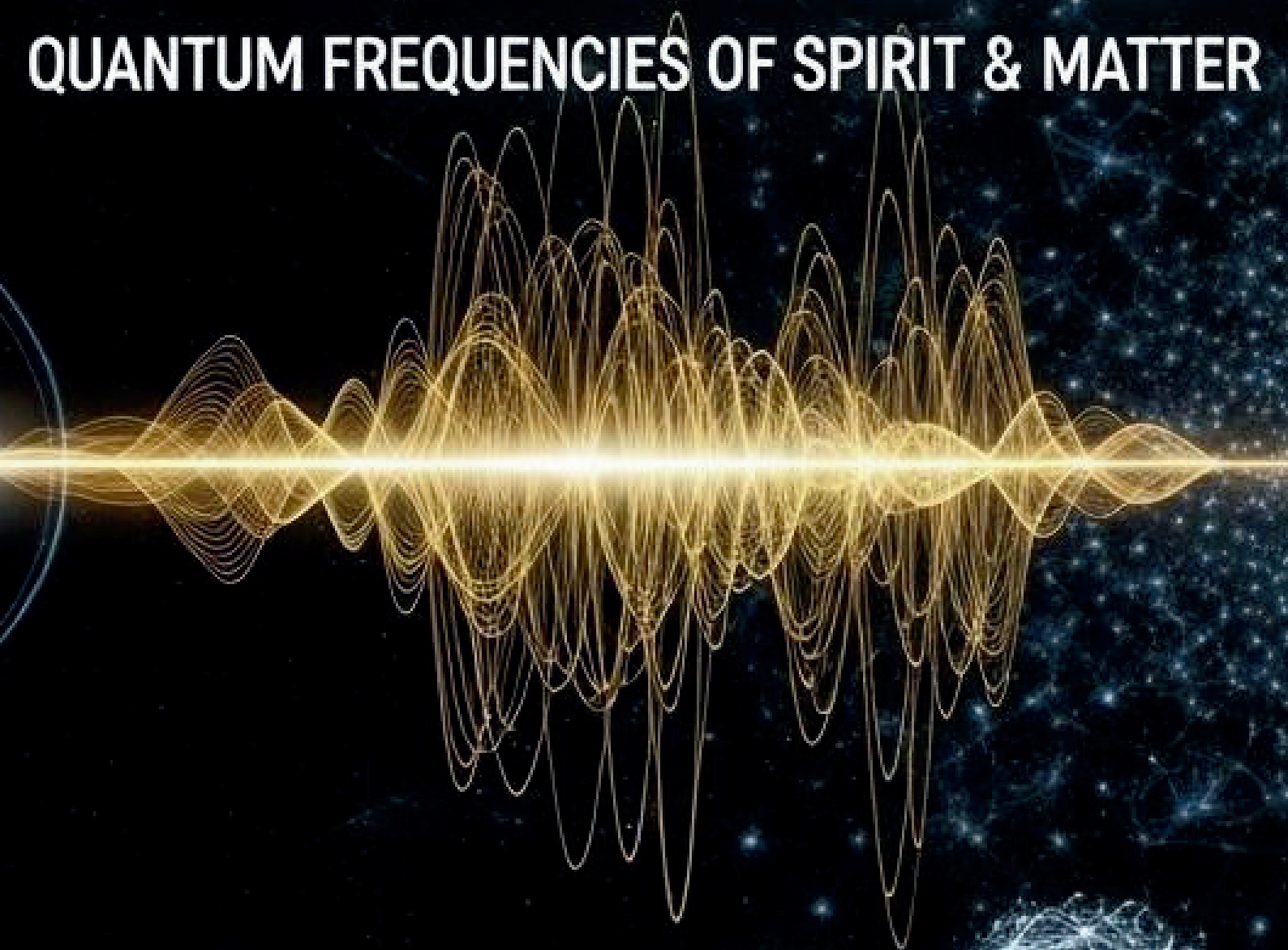

At the center of this journey stands Cheonjon-nim—The Supreme One. Cheonjon-nim is not a deity of myth or a distant figure of tradition, but the living essence of the universe itself: the origin of all light, Ki (life energy), and the eternal laws of Yin and Yang.

Today, many of us drift through life in a state of quiet despair or blind belief, having forgotten the natural order of Heaven and Earth. This book does not seek to persuade or argue. Instead, it simply opens a door to a reality that is structured, near, and profoundly real.

Here, death is not seen as an end, but as a "body-soul split"—a transition where the physical returns to the earth and the spiritual soul begins its journey toward the light. We explore how the frequencies of our ancestors still resonate within us, and how, through rites of reconciliation and the practice of self-cultivation, we can mend the broken chains of the past.

Key Terms Glossary: Understanding the Unseen World

Cheonjon-nim : The Supreme One. The living essence and the original source of the universe. Not a deity of a specific religion, but the fundamental frequency and light from which all life, Ki, and the laws of nature originate.

Ki : Life Energy / Vital Frequency. The invisible force that animates all existence. In this book, it is often described as a vibration or frequency that connects the physical and spiritual realms.

Yeonghon : The Spiritual Soul. A combination of *Yeong* (the eternal luminous spirit) and *Hon* (the emotional and human imprint). It represents the conscious self that continues its journey after the physical body expires.

Yin&Yang : The Dual Harmony. The fundamental law of balance in the universe. In the context of death, the body (Yin) returns to the earth, while the spirit (Yang) returns to the unseen world.

Jeryeong : Spirit Release / Reconciliation. A sacred process of gently detaching the heavy, unresolved vibrations (often of ancestors) from the living. It is an act of love that grants freedom to both the departed and the descendant.

Yeongsu : 21-Day Purification. A disciplined period of spiritual alignment where a practitioner purifies their own Ki to help cleanse the burdens and sorrows of their lineage.

Cheondo : **The Rite of Sending**. The final ritual of guiding a purified soul back to its original home in the higher realms (Heavenly Paradise), ensuring it aligns with the cosmic law.

Cheonsu Healing : **Heaven's Hand**. A healing practice of channeling high-frequency cosmic Ki through the hands to dissolve energy blockages and restore physical and spiritual vitality.

Haneul 12 JinBeop : **The 12 Heavenly Laws of Training**. A sequence of twelve movements and breathing patterns designed to realign an individual's internal frequency with the rhythm of Great Nature.

Han : **Unresolved Sorrow / Deep Regret**. A heavy emotional frequency left behind by the departed, which can create spiritual ties that bind them to the earthly plane.

Cheonmun : **The Heavenly Gate/Law**. The cosmic gate way or the divine order that a soul must pass through to return to the source of light.

Chapter 1: When Life Ends — A Whisper from Beyond

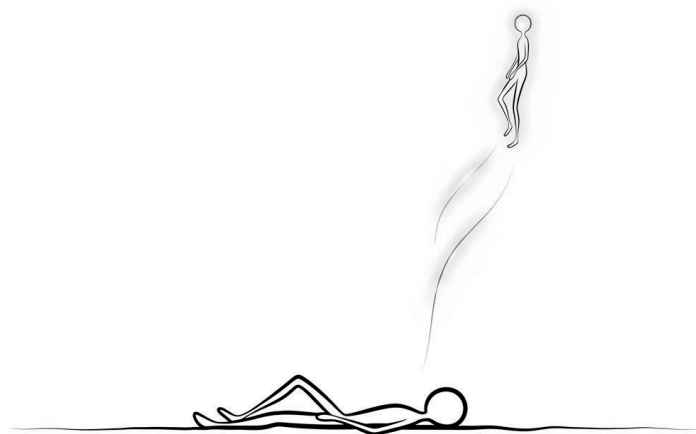
The Law of Frequencies : Both this world and the unseen world are woven of Ki—energy and vibration. We cannot see across the veil only because the

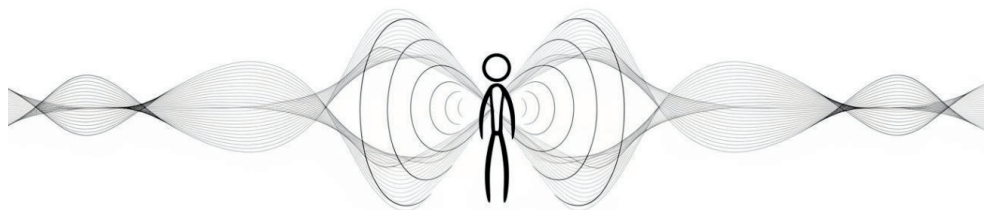
He explained the hidden mechanics of this encounter:

2. Yeongsu : The 21-Day Purification

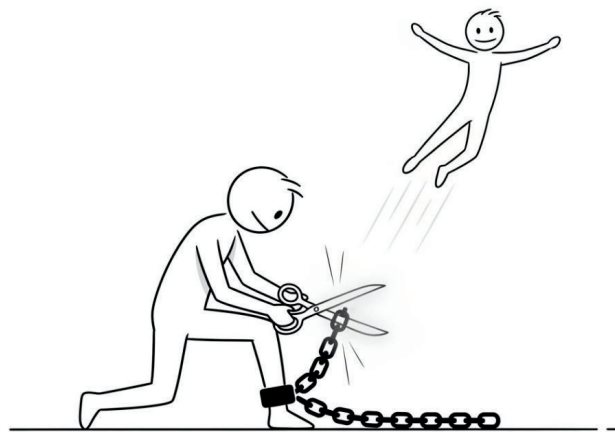

frequencies with the rhythm of Great Nature. We stop drifting and start flowing with the universe.

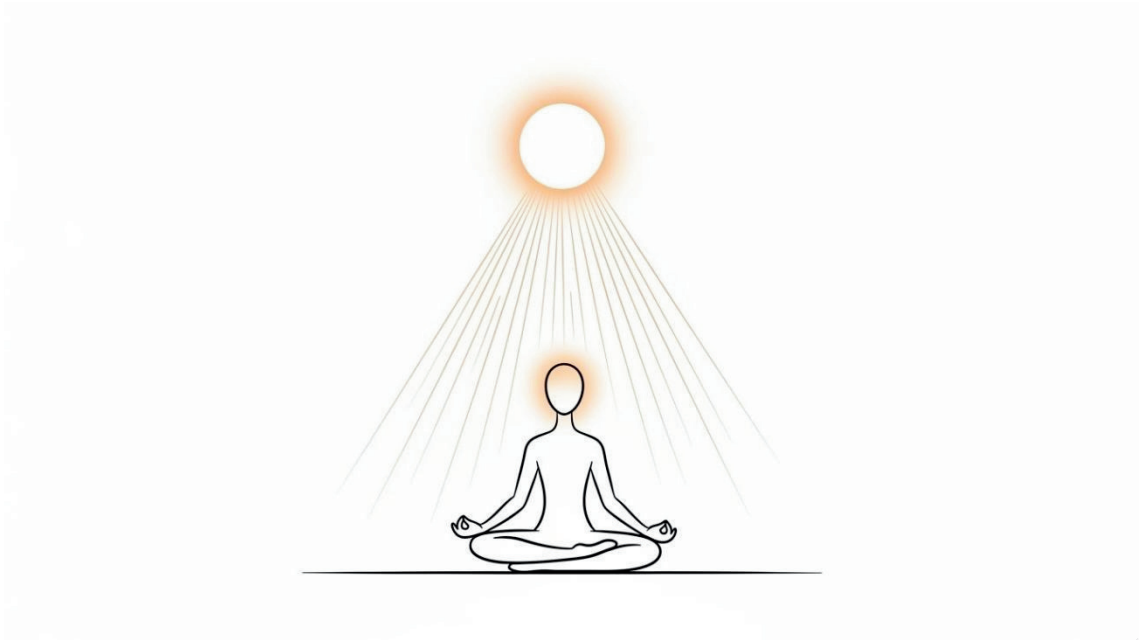
3. Living as Children of Heaven
